



## Highlights

Since April, Ventures has been providing virtual services to consumers using social platforms such as Facebook and Zoom. It has been a new and exciting way to connect with everyone during the COVID-19 "Safer at Home" order by Wisconsin Governor, Tony Evers. We plan to continue and expand this new and innovative service.

During the height of the stay at home order, many of our consumers connected with staff using the virtual services. Classes included a cooking class, pre-vocational job development, hobby/art classes, health and wellness, essential job skills training and Skills to Pay the Bills. A few times a week, a more social interaction with trivia, current events, or a story by Carolyn of Cameron were offered. Classes were taught and moderated by all three program directors, job developers, staff members, and Kristin Frane, Director of Ventures Unlimited.

Renee E. and Victoria M. from Shell Lake were asked what they liked most about the virtual classes. Victoria stated that being able to, "see others and connect" with the Zoom conferencing platform was her favorite thing about the classes. Renee agreed that connecting on Zoom was her favorite, but that she, " really liked the exercise class on Wellness Wednesday". Neither Renee nor Victoria had anything they disliked about the virtual programming and Renee went on to say that she hopes Ventures continues with the classes everyday as well as during holiday breaks!

Ventures will continue to use this learning experience as a stepping stone to offer future opportunities in virtual services for current and new consumers. The services are a method of fostering social connections during a time of isolation. As well, virtual offerings promote service continuity in lieu of in-person interactions that is open for ventures staff and consumers to have real-time discussion with two-way question and answer time allowed by the virtual platforms.
